<u>3 Indians in Time Magazine's list of</u> <u>'100 most influential people of 2021'</u>

- Journalist Barkha Dutt has written the profile of West Bengal CM Mamata Banerjee. The magazine describes her as the "face of fierceness in Indian politics".
- The profile of SII CEO Adar Poonawallalt has been written by Abhishyant Kidangoor, a producer with Time Magazine. Adar Poonawalla features in the 'Pioneers' section of the Time Magazine list.
- Apart from PM Narendra Modi, CM Mamata Banerjee and SII CEO Adar Poonawalla, the list includes US President Joe Biden, US Vice-President Kamala Harris, Chinese

President Xi Jinping, former US President Donald Trump and the Duke and Duchess of Sussex — Prince Harry and Meghan.

• Interestingly, the name of the Taliban co-founder Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar also features in Time Magazine's list of 'Most Influential People of 2021'. Taliban founder Mullah Omar, too, featured on Time Magazine's cover in 2001.
