- The majority of Belarus is situated within the Dnieper River basin and is also home to the Mukhavate, a tributary of the Bug River.

## **India Belarus Relations**

- India and Belarus have had a strong relationship since Belarus gained independence in 1991.
- They cooperate in multilateral forums like the UNSC and NSG, with Belarus supporting India's candidacy for a UNSC seat in 2020.
- India also supports Belarus in international groups like the NAM and IPU.
