- This recognizes and acknowledges the existence of various gender identities beyond the traditional male and female categories, such as non-binary and transgender identities.
- In line with the government's commitment to empower 'Nari Shakti,' the MWCD is actively engaged in initiatives to foster gender equality and empowerment.
