Reasons

- Higher quality of life: Emigration is greatly enticed by the higher standard of living, salaries, and tax advantages offered by developed nations.
- Simple migration regulations: As fertility rates decline, developed nations are loosening immigration restrictions in an effort to attract talent and boost their economies.
- Opportunities for higher education are scarce: In India, it is difficult to get into higher education because of the increasing number of competitive exams and cutoffs.
- Lower-income: Sectors like health care, research, and information technology receive higher wages in developed nations. One of the main factors that leads to emigration from India is income.
- Lack of financial support for research:
 For a number of years, India's
 research spending has remained at
 0.7% of GDP. Among the BRICS
 nations, India has one of the lowest
 GERD/GDP ratios. As a result,
 researchers frequently relocate
 abroad to continue their work.



Consequences

- Remittances from Indian emigration will be sent back to India.
- India received \$89,127 million in foreign inward remittances in 2021-2022, the highest amount ever received in a single year.
- It will help India's interests overseas.
- Emigration is a net loss of talent that benefits the foreign economy by developing skills at the expense of the Indian taxpayer.
- India loses skilled workers as a result of emigration.

Initiatives

- The INSPIRE (Innovation in Science Pursuit of Inspiring Research)
 Program: The program aims to get talented young people interested in science early on and build the critical pool of people who can help strengthen and grow the science and technology system and R&D base.
- The Ramanujan Foundation: It is intended to provide excellent Indian scientists from outside India with opportunities to work in India in scientific research.
- The Fellowship of Ramalingaswami: It gives scientists who want to come back and work in India a platform.
- Vaishvik Bharatiya Vaigyanik (VAIBHAV) highest point: Under this, a lot of Indians and academics from other countries who are of Indian descent worked together to come up with creative solutions to a few problems.
