- It covers the entire period from election announcement to the declaration of election result, and such elections include not only parliamentary and state levels, but even municipal level ones.

Details on the Issue

Transparency Initiative

- The ECI's action describes the ECI's decision to make accountability of its enforcement action the undeclared reason but a self-imposed measure acts as a proper transparency facilitator.
- This is one of the many projects carried out by the Commission, where they focus on ensuring that the filtering process is safeguarded and the parties and candidates are given fair and equal conditions to operate.

Compliance with MCC

- The ECI has pronounced itself pleased with the comprehensive upholding of the democratic norms, standards, and procedures by political parties and candidates.
- The campaigns have been conducted the way the establishment of the concept was done with utmost attention to detail, a cleaner electoral scenario.

Monitoring and Vigilance

- The ECI has placed the onus on party chiefs and presidents to ensure that their members maintain decorum and refrain from disrespectful commentary.
- The enforcement of the <u>MCC</u> has been characterised by responsiveness and firmness, as promised by the Chief Election Commissioner, Shri Rajiv Kumar.

Legal and Judicial Considerations

- As the ECI implements the MCC, it has been very cautious not to interfere with the court process.
- The Commission itself is a strong supporter of the party and candidate level playing field and has continued to comply with the bothly entitlements.

Enforcement Actions

- Such action may include requesting immediate fact-checks on hate speech or issuing warning letters to candidates or political parties. In addition, fines may be imposed for failure to comply with the code.

- Public Awareness: Bringing more of the public qualified about the MCC and how it plays a role in safeguarding the conduct of elections is one area that can be centred on by ECI.
- Technology Integration: For example, the ECI can be geared towards more complex things and can use advanced technologies like artificial intelligence and data analytics to track and address the violations more efficiently.
- Collaboration with Social Media: Managing social media position in order to prevent a
 wide spread of fake news and hate speeches during election periods, should be one of
 the most important tactics.

The ECI's actions in the first month of enforcing the MCC guidelines set a standard for future elections. By making their enforcement actions public, the ECI shows a commitment to transparency and fairness.
